- 1. While Murray's Oxford English Dictionary is certainly the largest and most impressive lexicon in the English language, it was certainly not the first.
- 2. One notable work by an earlier scholar was Dr. Samuel Johnson's *A Dictionary of the English Language*, published in 1755.
- 3. Johnson's cleverness and wit permeated the entire book, and some of his definitions have become famous for their humor.
- 4. The final work contained 114,000 entries and filled two complete volumes.
- 5. Considering it was all the work of one man, Johnson's dictionary is considered a monumental success of scholarship.
- 6. The dictionary included quotations to illustrate the usage of words.
- 7. These quotations generally came from classical works of English Literature by authors such as Shakespeare, Dryden, and Milton.
- 8. The work took nine years and caused its author much stress; however, it cemented his reputation and won him much fame.
- 9. Some praise for the work came from its patron, the Earl of Chesterfield, who had promised Johnson financial support while he wrote the text.
- 10. Johnson, however, grew impatient with his patron and wrote a scathing letter outlining his displeasure.
